As you stroll along the streets flanking the hotels, you'll find an array of souvenir shops and delightful restaurants, perfect for a leisurely evening.

Day 2: Journey to Sigiriya via Pinnawala - An Enchanting Adventure

Start your day with a delightful breakfast at the hotel before embarking on a mesmerizing journey from Negombo to Sigiriya, with an enchanting stop at the Pinnawala Elephant Orphanage.

Located approximately 55 miles from Colombo, Pinnawala is a sanctuary for abandoned and wounded elephants, established in 1975. This remarkable orphanage has grown to house over 65 elephants, including baby elephants brought from various parts of Sri Lanka and 23 babies born through its successful captive breeding program. The best times to visit are during the feeding sessions from 9:30 to 10:00 AM and 1:30 to 2:00 PM, and the bathing sessions from 10:00 to 10:30 AM and 2:00 to 2:30 PM, when you can witness these majestic creatures being led to the nearby river for their daily bath.

After this heartwarming experience, continue your journey to Sigiriya. Upon arrival, check in to your hotel and immerse yourself in the tranquil surroundings, ready for the adventures that await.

Conclude your enchanting day with an overnight stay at your hotel in Sigiriya, dreaming of the wonders you've seen and those yet to come.

Day 3: Exploring the Wonders of Sigiriya and Dambulla

Start your day with a delicious breakfast at the hotel before embarking on an unforgettable adventure to the Sigiriya Fortress.

Sigiriya, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is known as the "Fortress in the Sky" and stands as one of the most fantastic wonders of the island. Also called Lion Rock, it features the remains of a huge lion statue that once guarded the entrance to the palace atop the 600-foot high rock. At the summit, you can explore the foundations of the Royal Palace, water tanks, guardhouses, and other structures. One of the stairways features the only known ancient work of Sinhala secular painting, with frescoes of 21 life-sized damsels preserved in their original vibrant colors. Don't miss the Water Gardens, Fountain Garden, summerhouse, Boulder Gardens, and the intriguing caves.

After exploring Sigiriya, you will transfer to Dambulla to visit the famous Dambulla Cave Temple. This vast, isolated rock mass rises 500 feet high and spans a mile around its base. Dating back to the First Century B.C., the caves once sheltered King Walagamba during his 14-year exile from Anuradhapura. Upon reclaiming his throne, he built the most magnificent rock temples on the island. In the first cave, you'll find a 47-foot long recumbent Buddha carved out of rock, surrounded by images of deities associated with Buddhism. The oldest frescoes on the walls and ceiling, although overpainted during the Kandy period, still captivate with their beauty. The second cave, the largest and finest, houses 150 life-sized statues of Buddha in various postures, along with statues of gods and kings. The ceiling frescoes depict significant events in Buddha's life and milestones in Sinhalese history.

After immersing yourself in the historical and spiritual wonders of Dambulla, return to your hotel for some leisure time.

Enjoy a peaceful overnight stay at your hotel in Sigiriya, reflecting on the incredible sights and experiences of the day.

Day 4: Journey to Polonnaruwa - A Step Back in Time

Explore the unique Vata-da-ge, a remarkable creation of Sri Lankan artists. The medieval capital of Polonnaruwa was fortified with inner and outer moats and walls. On the western side of the city lies the Parakrama Samudra, a vast reservoir. Within the inner city, visit the Royal Palace, Audience Hall, and other historic buildings, all enclosed by a tall protective wall.

After a day filled with historical exploration, return to your hotel to relax and reflect on the day's discoveries.

Wander through the colorful Kandy market, brimming with fresh fruits and vegetables. As evening approaches, enhance your experience by attending a cultural show that features traditional music and drumming, showcasing the rich and vibrant culture of Sri Lanka.

Conclude your captivating day with an overnight stay at your hotel in Kandy, reflecting on the day's cultural delights.

Day 7: Journey to Nuwara Eliya - The Enchanting Highlands

En route, visit a tea plantation in Nuwara Eliya. Tea was first planted in Sri Lanka in 1824 at the Botanical Gardens in Peradeniya with plants brought from China. In 1867, Scottish planter James Taylor initiated the tea industry on an 8-hectare forest land in the Loolkondura Estate. By 1873, Sri Lanka began exporting tea, with the first modest shipment of 23 lbs. to London. Today, Sri Lanka is the world's largest tea exporter, with over 200,000 hectares dedicated to tea cultivation, producing around 300 million kilograms annually.

After exploring the tea plantation and learning about its rich history, continue your journey to Nuwara Eliya, often referred to as the 'Little England' of Sri Lanka. Nestled amidst stunning backdrops of mountains, valleys, waterfalls, and tea plantations, Nuwara Eliya exudes a quaint charm.

Enjoy a city tour of Nuwara Eliya, a town that showcases British influence through its country cottages and Queen Anne-style mansions. Visit Victoria Park, located in the heart of the town, perfect for a leisurely stroll or a picnic, and a haven for bird watchers with its rare bird species. Nuwara Eliya experiences distinct seasons, with flowers blooming in the spring (March to May) and the fall (July, August, and September), attracting visitors seeking to escape the heat and humidity of the lowlands.

After your delightful exploration, check in to your hotel and enjoy the rest of the day at your leisure.

Conclude your enchanting day with an overnight stay at your hotel in Nuwara Eliya, surrounded by the cool, serene highlands.

Day 8: Nuwara Eliya to Horton Plains - A Nature Lover's Paradise

Located 20 miles (32 km) from Nuwara Eliya via Ambewela and Pattipola, Horton Plains spans 3,160 hectares and is known to Sri Lankans as Mahaeliya. Renamed after Sir Robert Horton, British Governor from 1831-1837, it became a nature reserve in 1969 and was upgraded to a national park in 1988 due to its unique watershed and biodiversity values. The plains are characterized by a high level of endemism in its flora. The hills are covered with diverse wet low evergreen forests, with trees flattened to the ground on the higher, windswept slopes.

Horton Plains is home to 52 species of resident birds and 11 species of migratory birds. The forests and grasslands harbor a variety of wildlife, including more than 2,000 to 3,000 sambhur, as well as bear monkeys, leopards, barking deer, giant squirrels, fishing cats, wild boars, and hares. While most of these animals are elusive, sambhur are commonly seen in the morning and evening.

After exploring the natural wonders of Horton Plains, return to your hotel in Nuwara Eliya and enjoy the rest of the day at your leisure.

End your day with a peaceful overnight stay at your hotel in Nuwara Eliya, surrounded by the breathtaking highland scenery.

Day 9: Journey from Nuwara Eliya to Yala via Ella - A Scenic Expedition
