Day 1: Welcome To The Land Of Pharaohs

A private air-conditioned car will then transfer you to a hotel for check-in. In the evening, You will enjoy a dinner cruise on the enchanting Nile, featuring a colorful belly dancing show with a folklore band and a majestic Tannoura spin reflecting Egypt's whirling dervishes tradition. Day 2: Explore Giza Pyramids Complex

After breakfast and checking out from the hotel, will visit the Giza Pyramids Complex, a timeless symbol of Egypt's grandeur. The complex, which has stood for over 4000 years, showcases the glory of Egyptian civilization.

The Great Pyramid Of Khufu

You will marvel at the Great Pyramid of Khufu, built in 2570 BC. This pyramid, standing at 147 meters (481 feet), was the tallest building in the world from 2600 BC to 1311 AD. Its massive weight and height enable the attraction to become the only standing member of the seven wonders of the ancient world.

The Great Sphinx

Then visit the Great Sphinx, a mythical creature with the body of a lion and the facial features of King Khafre (2558-2532 BC). It stands as an immortal example of his wisdom and power, with a height of 73 meters (240 feet) and a width of 19 meters (66 feet).

The Valley Temple

The tour continues to the Valley Temple, the center of the mummification process known as the ceremony of the opening of the mouth. This well-preserved archaeological site provides significant information about the religion and funerary practices of ancient Egypt.

The Grand Egyptian Museum

You will visit the Grand Egyptian Museum, which houses some of the greatest archaeological monuments and artifacts ever made, including the Hanging Obelisk, King Ramses II Statue, the 10 Statues of King Senusert, the Grand Staircase, Statues of Ptolemaic Kings and Queens, the Victory Column of King Merneptah, the epic Royal Regalia, and the Grand Atrium & Gift shop.

After visiting these attractions, you will enjoy a delicious lunch meal before continuing their tour.

Memphis City

Next, visit Memphis City, the first official capital of Egypt, established by King Menes Narmer in 2925 BC. Memphis became known as the center of rule and the home of the main worship temple of god Ptah, the patron of creation and artwork.

Saqqara Step Pyramid

Then explore the Saqqara Step Pyramid, designed by the brilliant Imhotep, the vizier of Pharaoh Djoser. This pyramid, with its six-step design, stands at a height of 62 meters and showcases the remarkable art and decorations of ancient Egypt.

Afterward, will head to Cairo Airport to catch your flight to Aswan and check in at a Hotel for an O/N stay.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch

Day 3: Witness The Wonders Of The Nubian City Aswan

On day three, Enjoy breakfast at the hotel in Aswan and continue their holiday in Egypt by exploring some of the top Aswan tourist attractions.

The High Dam

Visit the High Dam, constructed between 1960 and 1970 as a cooperation project with the Moscow-based Hydro project Institute. The dam was designed to control Nile flooding, generate hydroelectricity, and increase water storage for irrigation.

The Unfinished Obelisk

Next, Visit the Unfinished Obelisk, ordered by Queen Hatshepsut (1508-1458 BC) to stand at the entrance of the Karnak Temple. It would have reached a height of 42 meters and weighed 1200 tons but was left incomplete due to a crack during construction.

Enjoy a lunch meal before visiting the next attraction.

Philae Temple

Visit Philae Temple, a mythological wonder of ancient Egypt, which tells the story of Osiris, Isis, Set, and Horus. The temple was relocated in the 1960s on the island of Agilkia as part of a rescue mission led by UNESCO to save it from being submerged. O/N at Hotel at Aswan.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch

Day 4: Visit Abu Simbel Temples

In the early morning, take breakfast boxes, check out from the hotel, and join your tour guide for a drive to the southwest of Aswan, approximately 300 km, to witness the Abu Simbel Temples.

Abu Simbel Temples

The Abu Simbel Temples, created by Ramses II (1279-1213 BCE), consist of two temples: the main temple dedicated to Ramses

and the smaller temple dedicated to his wife Queen Nefertari. The temples were the focus of a challenging archaeological rescue operation led by UNESCO in the mid-1960s.

At the end of the day tour, you will return to Aswan for lunch. O/N at Hotel at Luxor.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch

Day 5: Explore The Largest Open-air Museum In The World

On the fifth day, Enjoy breakfast at the hotel and continue their vacation by exploring Luxor East Bank attractions. O/N at Hotel at Luxor.

Karnak Temple

Visit Karnak Temple, known as Ipet-Isu ("The Most Selected of Places") and Pr-Imn ("House of Amon"). Constructed over 4000 years ago, it was the worship center of ancient Egypt, dedicated mainly to the Theban triad: God Amun, Goddess Mut, and God Khonsu.

Enjoy lunch at an outstanding restaurant in Luxor before returning to the hotel to refresh. In the evening, you will move with your tour guide to visit Luxor Temple by night.

Luxor Temple By Night

Luxor Temple, constructed in 1400 BCE during the reign of Pharaoh Amenhotep III, shines brightest at night. The temple, known as Ipetresyet ("The Southern Sanctuary"), was dedicated to God Amun and features extensive decorations and constructions.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch

Day 6: Complete Your Trip In Luxor

After breakfast and checking out from the hotel, you will continue your trip in Luxor by exploring the rest of the mesmerizing Luxor tourist attractions. O/N at Hotel at Luxor.

Hatshepsut Temple

Hatshepsut Temple, also known as Djoser-Djeseru ("Holy of Holies"), is a beautiful example of ancient Egyptian civilization. Built in 1479 BC during Egypt's New Kingdom, the temple features captivating artifacts and statues.

Valley Of The Kings

Then visit the Valley of the Kings, a burial site for the Egyptian kings and queens of the New Kingdom (1570-1070 BC). It contains 63 tombs filled with treasures, artifacts, statues, and decorations, including the tombs of Ramses (I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, IX, X), Amenhotep I, Hatshepsut, and Tutankhamen.

Have a break to enjoy lunch before visiting the next attraction.

Colossi Of Memnon

The Colossi of Memnon, two blocks of quartzite sandstone standing at 18 meters (60 feet) and weighing 720 tons each, depict Pharaoh Amenhotep III (1386-1350 BC). The statues were damaged by an earthquake in 27 BC and rebuilt in 199 AD.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch

Day 7: Fly To Cairo - Visit Cairo Top Attraction

On the seventh day, the tour continues with breakfast at the hotel in Luxor, followed by check-out and a flight to Cairo. The day is dedicated to exploring some of Cairo's most renowned tourist attractions. O/N at Hotel at Cairo.

The Egyptian Museum

The Egyptian Museum is an extraordinary repository of ancient Egyptian artifacts spanning over 4000 years. It houses an extensive collection of items crafted from gold, precious gems, wood, and stone, including statues, jewelry, and funerary objects that showcase the rich history and artistic prowess of ancient Egypt.

A break for a delicious lunch provides a moment to relax and refresh before continuing the tour.

The Hanging Church

The Hanging Church, also known as “The Holy Church of the Virgin Mary,” is a central site of Coptic culture in Cairo. Built on the southern wall of the Roman fortress of Babylon in the 5th century AD, the church stands 30 feet tall and offers a mesmerizing blend of artistic elements from the 7th to the 13th centuries.

Amr Ibn Al Aas Mosque

The Amr Ibn Al Aas Mosque, constructed in 641 AD, is one of Egypt’s most significant Islamic landmarks. It has been reconstructed several times over the centuries, showcasing the evolution of Islamic architecture.

Ben Ezra Synagogue

Ben Ezra Synagogue, dating back to the 19th century, was originally a church before becoming a synagogue in 882 AD. It remains well-preserved, featuring impressive Jewish designs and decorations, and served as a major center for Jewish worship until the 1950s.

The National Museum Of Egyptian Civilization

The National Museum of Egyptian Civilization (NMEC) is a remarkable institution that highlights Egypt’s cultural and historical heritage through an incredible collection of artifacts and monuments spanning over 4000 years.

Al Muizz Street

Al Muizz Street, a historical street dating back to the Fatimid period in the 10th century AD, is renowned for its stunning examples of Islamic architecture and vibrant atmosphere, featuring cafes, house museums, and a wealth of artistic and cultural treasures.

Khan El Khalili Bazaar

Khan El Khalili Bazaar, established in 970 AD, is a bustling marketplace offering a unique glimpse into the past. It is filled with vintage cafes, shops, and exquisite examples of Islamic architecture, making it a must-visit for travelers.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch

Day 8: Discover The Bride Of The Mediterranean Sea - Alexandria

On the eighth day, after enjoying breakfast, the journey continues to Alexandria, known as the Bride of the Mediterranean Sea, to explore its top attractions. O/N at Hotel at Cairo.

Catacombs Of Kom El Shoqafa

The Catacombs of Kom El Shoqafa, constructed in the 2nd century AD, are a unique archaeological site that blends Hellenistic, Roman, and ancient Egyptian artistic elements. This necropolis, known as one of the seven wonders of the Middle Ages, houses numerous Greek and Roman artifacts and decorations across its three levels.

Pompey’s Pillar

Pompey’s Pillar, the largest monolithic column outside Rome, stands at 28 meters tall and 2.7 meters wide. Made of pure red granite, it features a Greek inscription dedicated to Emperor Diocletian and was mistakenly believed to contain the remains of the Roman general Pompey.

A special lunch at a local restaurant in Alexandria allows for a culinary delight amidst the tour.

Qaitbay Citadel

Qaitbay Citadel, built in 1477 by Sultan Al-Ashraf Sayf Al-Din Qa'it Bay, stands on the site of the ancient Lighthouse of Alexandria. This important Islamic landmark was constructed using salvaged stones from the original lighthouse and continues to capture the spirit of the historic structure.

Alexandria Library

The modern Alexandria Library, a tribute to the ancient Library of Alexandria, is one of the world's most advanced libraries. It houses the sixth-largest Francophone library globally, with books in Arabic, English, and French, as well as majestic art galleries and rare book collections.
